News from the treasurer

As of March 3, we had \$26,059.56 in our bank account with no outstanding cheques. Our district grant was deposited on February 20 in the amount of \$18,000.

Our district budget for 2024 was sent to RTOERO in Toronto and it was approved.

At the district meeting in January, the executive passed a motion to continue to support the bursary program in the secondary schools in Prescott-Russell. An amount of \$300 each was given to the following eight schools: Rockland District High School, Russell High School, Vankleek Hill Collegiate Institute, St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic High School, St. Francis Xavier Catholic High School, TR Leger School - Russell, TR Leger School - Rockland and TR Leger School - Hawkesbury.

This bursary is to be given to a graduating student entering post-secondary studies, priority given to one who is considering a career in the education field. The following considerations should be given to academic achievement, participation in a range of school activities, shows enthusiasm for team building in the school and/or community through mentoring, tutoring, coaching, volunteering, and aiming to work in an elementary, secondary or post-secondary school after their post-secondary studies.
